## please help yourself and your neighbors

Is your sump pump running in your basement? Do you know where it discharges your excess water? If your pump hose is connected to your sanitary sewer drain line, you are contributing to a major problem! With the infiltration of rain water during large downpours or wet seasons, sewer lines may become overloaded and cause backups in basements or overflow at lift stations and the treatment plant. City Ordinance Title 10: Chapter 2: Article 3.10.1 and 15, states that ground and storm water are forbidden to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system. It also states that from October 15 to April 15, the Council will allow sump pumps to be directed into the sanitary sewer to help eliminate ice buildups in our streets. Over the years, people have forgotten to remove these same sump pumps from their sanitary sewer connections and to get them outside during the spring and summer. You can put the ground water into your backyard or into the street gutter system. These sump pumps have caused some of your neighbors' significant problems with backup this spring and in the past. We need and require every sump pump to be directed outdoors after April 15 every year to help alleviate the problem we have again seen this spring. We know that with your help we can get this done.

City Staff is reviewing the rainfall events from the Memorial Day weekend and will seek/recommend ways to mitigate storm water and sanitary sewer flow restrictions in the future.
