fourteen-unit orange city rental project gets nearly \$835,000 in federal funds



A planned housing complex in Orange City has just been advised that they will receive nearly \$835,000 in federal funds. The lowa Finance Authority, or "IFA" Board of Directors has announced affordable housing awards to fifteen affordable rental projects in lowa totaling more than \$82.4 million in federal housing tax credits and HOME program awards to build and preserve 650 affordable housing units in thirteen lowa counties. Among them is the 14-unit complex in Orange City.

The Orange City complex is being called Prairie Heights, LLC. It will be at 900 14th Street SE. Fourteen affordable units for families are planned. The tax credit award is for nearly \$285,000, and the HOME award is for \$550,000. It is being developed by Excel Health Services, doing business as Excel Development Group.

2014 downtown street improvements

The City of Orange City is doing a street project this summer. This will include the streets of 2nd St. SW between Central and Arizona, 1st St. W between Central and Arizona, 2nd St NW between Central and Arizona, 2nd St. NE between Central and Albany and Central Ave. between 3rd St. and 5th St N.

This project is to start after Tulip Festival but not before May 22nd. Completion date is October 3rd, 2014. These streets will include complete pavement removal, some curb and sidewalk removal, and adding water mains and storm sewers. Light pole replacements will be added along with new 6" PCC pavement and 4" PCC sidewalks. There will be some paver and trees to match the Central Ave. project. The contractor will only be able to rip up a certain amount of project at one time so that traffic flow is not totally restricted downtown.

free e-recycling program

The Cities of Orange City & Alton are co-sponsoring a free e-recycling program that will accept computer monitors, CPU's, keyboards, printers and mouse(s), smaller batteries, and tv's. Sorry, car batteries and light bulbs are not allowed. Items can be dropped off at Alton City Hall, 905 3rd Avenue on Friday, April 25th, 4-7 pm and Saturday, April 26th, 9:00am -12pm.

it's time to shine

OC's Annual Spring Clean-Up, sponsored by the City of OC and OC Sanitation, will be held April 21-25. OC residents must purchase a \$10 lawn flag (one for each household) from the City Office (125 Central Ave. SE) or OC Sanitation (710 Ohio St. SW). Sanitation crews will only remove those items that have a special lawn flag displayed nearby. All disposed items must be placed at your usual pick-up site on your regular garbage pick-up day.

Allowable items: garage and home items, furniture/wood items, and mattresses/carpets. Non-allowable items: all appliances/white goods, TV's (may dispose of with e-recycling see above), building-remodeling materials, wood chips, auto parts (tires, batteries, etc.), concrete, steel/iron, yard waste, tree branches, oil, yard chemicals, or wet paints. Special pick-up arrangements may be available for these items with OC Sanitation (737-2645).
