At this meeting, the City and contractor will talk about the schedule of construction, working with businesses, traffic flow, working hours, crews needed, etc. The City is looking forward to continuing this street project and hopes that all involved will help this project go smooth. when the sirens blow

When you hear the warning sirens, do you know what it means? As part of the weather alert system, the OC Fire Dept. dispatches storm observers when severe weather threatens our immediate area. When funnel clouds, suspicious cloud rotations, or high velocity wind speeds are detected, the Sioux County Sheriff Dept. is instructed



to activate the OC sirens. A 3-minute long warning is sounded. This means OC residents should seek immediate shelter and turn to public TV and radio stations for current information. Please note that the sirens are not re-activated to give an "ALL CLEAR" notice.

winter parking ends

The end of winter also means the end of the seasonal "No Parking" ordinance as of April 1st. Residents and visitors will once again be allowed to park vehicles overnight where permitted on public streets. be a responsible animal owner

Unfortunately, some animal owners are allowing their animals to leave their waste on their neighbor's lawn, in city parks, along the golf course trail, the Puddle Jumper Trail, streets, and other areas. Animal owners are required to clean up this waste. Orange City Code of Municipal Ordinances states "It shall be prohibited for any animal owner to permit or allow any animal, when at large, or under the control of

the owner or under the control of anyone authorized by the owner, to leave any animal wastes or excrement without removing the offensive material by any reasonable method without delay. The penalty for violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100.00." We appreciate your cooperation in cleaning up after your animals.

sump pumps

With rainfall and the flow in the sanitary sewer system, we do not want to have problems in basements. In ordinance Title 10: Chapter 2: Article 3.19-1 and 15, it states that ground and storm water are forbidden to discharge into the sanitary sewer system. It also states that from October 15 to April 15, the Council will allow this to happen with sump pumps. Over the years, people have forgotten to remove these same sump pumps from their sanitary sewer connections and to get them outside during the spring and summer. You can put the ground water into your back yard or into the gutter system. These sump pumps have caused some of your neighbors' problems in the past. We need every sump pump to be directed outdoors after April 15 every year to help alleviate the problem we have again seen in the past. We know that with your help, we can get this accomplished.
