first in the nation iowa caucus exhibit

The exhibit "First in the Nation: Shaping Presidential Politics Since 1972" is on loan to the Orange City Public Library from the State Historical Museum of lowa from May 11 through June 2. It features images, film clips, newspaper articles, and nearly 200 artifacts from 1972 to 2012. "First in the Nation" explores candidates' journeys through the lowa caucus cycle. From early visits to the state to declaring a presidential bid, follow the path that candidates take as they organize their lowa campaigns, meet with the people of lowa, and participate in the excitement of caucus day. While lowa does not pick the president, it does serve the important role of narrowing the field of candidates and it takes pride in hosting the first in the nation presidential contest.

drones subject to FAA regulations

Drones (unmanned aircraft) are becoming more and more popular. Many people have purchased or will purchase a drone. When you fly your drone, please be aware that there are FAA regulations that do regulate the flight of drones.



The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulates all aircraft which includes drones. The FAA has implemented some operating limitations on the use of these known as regulations. These regulations took effect in December, 2015. The main regulations that affect our area are as follows:

- Drones weighing more than .55 pounds must be registered with the FAA (\$5 fee). A fine of \$27,500 could be imposed.
- You must be 13 years old or have an adult present while operating a drone outside.
- If you want to operate an unmanned aircraft (drone) within 5 miles of an airport, you must contact your local airport. Contact Dan Vander Weide (712)395-1633. Dan will discuss the impact on other aircraft and hospital helicopter operations and also point out the safest places to fly.
- Flying height is limited to 400 feet.
- You must keep the drone in sight at all times.
- If flying isn't for recreation but for compensation, even indirectly, you must request a permit from the FAA and hold a commercial pilots license.
- You may not mount any device that shoots a projectile.
- You must not interfere with and must give way to manned aircraft.
- Don't be careless or reckless with your unmanned aircraft or you could be fined from the Federal Government.
- Fines can be as much as \$250,000 and/or imprisonment for up to 3 years.
