

## home repair financial assistance available

There is financial assistance available for Sioux County residents to assist homeowners with upgrades, repairs, and improvements to houses. The program is the Northwest Iowa Regional Housing Trust Fund. The mission of the Housing Trust Fund is to promote the creation and preservation of affordable housing for low to moderate income persons residing in Sioux County. Financial assistance is provided for low to moderate income homeowners to make necessary home repairs. The assistance will be in the form of both forgivable grants/loans and/or low interest loans (2%) depending on the homeowner's income. The funding can be used for a variety of repairs such as basic structural repairs such as roofs, siding, or windows; building systems such as electrical upgrades, furnace replacements, or plumbing repairs; emergency repairs such as septic tank improvements, hot water heater replacements, or lead based paint reduction; weatherization such as insulation; or handicap improvements such as exterior ramps or bathroom facilities.

## thanks for helping us stay green

The Cities of Orange City and Alton, along with NW IA Area Solid Waste Agency, want to thank their citizens for helping us all preserve our landfill. Your help came from the collection of over 14.6 tons of Household Hazardous Materials (HHM) over the last 6 years alone. This means that not only have we kept these materials out of our landfill, but these materials have not been put down our drains and contaminated our sanitary sewer system. You have saved the cities many dollars in landfill costs and/or sanitary sewer costs. Here are the pounds collected during HHM pickups here in Orange City:

2011 - 5,180 Pounds 2014 - 5,470 Pounds 2012 - 3,160 Pounds 2015 - 3,740 Pounds 2013 - 7,580 Pounds 2016 - 4,200 Pounds

So again, we want to thank you, our citizens, for your help! We look forward to serving you with another HHM pickup in 2017.

## artrageous - a unique visual & musical journey



Krueger lives in Minnesota and is the author of the Cork O'Connor mystery series.
