
shrek the musical - 2017 tulip festival night show

There has been a lot of progress in 2016 at the new Sioux County Regional Airport. Portions of the runway, taxiway, and connectors are complete. About half of the apron paving is complete. The remainder of those areas will be completed in 2017. There is one building in the terminal area complete, with a great deal of terminal area construction that will continue into next year. The goal is to have the new airport open in 2018.

pushing the limits



Orange City Public Library will host a free four-part reading, viewing, and discussion series for adults called "Pushing the Limits" starting January 26 at 6:30 pm. The library is one of 100 rural public libraries nationwide receiving grants to host the series. "Pushing the Limits" brings together books and videos featuring authors, scientists, and everyday people who thrive on exploring the natural world.

The "Pushing the Limits" program will explore the ideas of Survival, Knowledge, Connection, and Nature in discussions that will include feature film quality videos and recommended popular books. The overarching theme is one of real people, real stories, and real science.

Group discussion events will be held once per month on the following topics and books:

- SURVIVAL: Clive Cussler, Arctic Drift January 26 at 6:30 pm
- KNOWLEDGE: Jean Auel, The Land of Painted Caves February 23 at 6:30 pm
- CONNECTION: Erik Larson, Thunderstruck March 23 at 6:30 pm
- NATURE: T.C. Boyle, When the Killing's Done April 27 at 6:30 pm

At our first meeting, Sara Tolsma, Professor of Biology at Northwestern College, will facilitate a discussion of the books and videos of author interviews and human interest stories. Read the books ahead of time if you are able. A free copy of the book is available for the first 25 registrants. Also available to loan from the library will be hard copies, with ebook & audiobook versions to download from OneClick Digital.
