# your dedicated team - wastewater & water treatment facilities

Pictured above you will find from L to R: Dave Sassman, Jerry Reuvers, and Kirk Maasdam. These gentlemen make sure you have safe, clean, drinkable water for washing, bathing, etc.

This dedicated group also makes sure our wastewater is purified so it can reenter the rivers and streams. The City of Orange City has been working on a new wastewater treatment facility to do just that. With more strict regulations from EPA and DNR, the City has to replace the lagoons we now have in place with a new mechanical plant. The plant that our engineers and DNR is giving us the ok on is called an SBR (Sequence Batch Reactor) plant. We are hoping this plant will go out for bid the first part of March, 2017 and start construction this spring. The estimated budget for this project will be approximately \$10 million. The plant will come to completion in late 2018 and then we will have a break-in period.

# orange city had a strong construction season in 2016

2016 was a transition year with the retiring of Ken Meendering and the hiring of Kurt Frederes. New residential single family homes were comparable to 2015 totals with over all permits being up. There were 14 single family home permits compared to 15 in 2015. We saw a significant increase in commercial and industrial buildings and additions. There were a total of 10 permits issued for new commercial or industrial buildings and additions to commercial or industrial buildings. This compares to 5 in 2015. The estimated costs for the 2016 commercial and industrial projects were \$12,716,909 compared to \$2,100,000 in 2015. There were a total of 82 building permits issued by the City of Orange City in 2016 compared to 65 in 2015. We anticipate another active year in 2017.

# 2016 solid waste and recycling totals are in

Reduce-Reuse-Recycle has been a long time slogan for the recycling movement. Today we often hear about "going green", "give it back", and "leave no footprint". Regardless of terminology, we are constantly reminded of how we could or should alter our lifestyle to conserve our planet's resources.

In 2016, Orange City delivered 3191.68 tons of solid waste to Northwest Iowa Solid Waste Agency. This compares to 3155.29 tons in 2015. Although 2016 was slightly higher than 2015, it is significantly lower than a ten year high of 3,457.96 tons of solid waste in 2010.

Orange City was able to divert 333.29 tons from the landfill through recycling in 2016, compared to 329.72 tons in 2015. Again, in 2010, there was 303.62 tons diverted from the landfill through recycling.

Although we are seeing a slight increase in recycling efforts, we continue to encourage all residents to recycle. With the new recycling toters, we anticipate less solid waste to the landfill and greater recycling in years to come. We appreciate everyone's effort to recycle.
