## new fire station takes shape

Here is the progress that has been made since the last newsletter. About 1/3rd of the outside concrete is poured; the apparatus bay is nearing completion on painting; gear lockers are here and waiting for installation; the gear room automatic door is installed; plumbing is nearing completion on all new construction; overhead doors are installed on new construction; LED is lighting is installed in apparatus bays; wiring is coming along nicely; and EFIS is complete. The project is still ahead of schedule and completion is projected for the fall of 2017.

This department maintains a total of 38 properties in town and provided close to 70 programs for the citizens of Orange City in 2016. Our department takes pride in delivering quality parks and programming that can meet the needs of every population group in Orange city. Spring can be a wild couple months in our department with close to 500 kids participating in youth soccer, and of course getting our parks ready for the Tulip Festival in May. Hopefully with this nice weather, we will see each and every one of you in our parks.
