2018 street improvements

The City of Orange City is doing two street projects the summer of 2018. This will include Delaware SW from 3rd St. SW south to 8th St. SW. A one block portion of 6th St SW from Delaware to Colorado SW will also be done. The other project will be Concord Place SE from 11th St. SE north to the alley between Ace Hardware and the Orange City Street Shop. Once we have opened bids and awarded contracts, we hope that both projects can be started. Completion date for the two City projects is expected to be around October 1, 2018.

The Delaware project will include complete seal coat removal, some curb and gutter replacement, sidewalk replacement on intersections/handicap approaches, replacing water mains, some driveway approaches, and storm sewers. Seal coat will be replaced by 6" PCC pavement.

The Concord project will include new curb and gutter, 7" PCC pavement and storm sewer improvements. New driveway approaches will also be included.

Bids for the two City projects will be received by the City Council on April 2 and a contract hopefully will be finalized at the April 16 council meeting.
