Construction will occur on the 1.9-acre parcel of land located at approximately 4495 St. Paul Ave. SE. RC Family Farms holds an option to purchase this land from Pipestone Veterinary Services. Expected capital investment is expected to be in excess of \$1,000,000. The project will retain the existing 31 jobs with the potential of creating an additional 9 new jobs over the next 24 months. They are requesting a ten year TIF rebate.

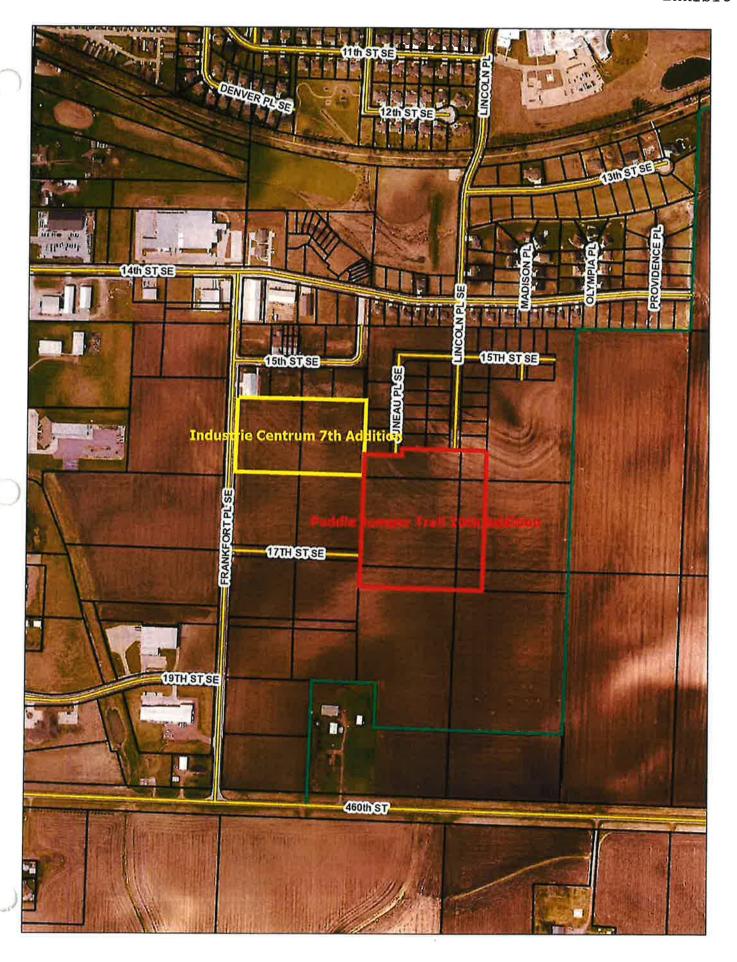

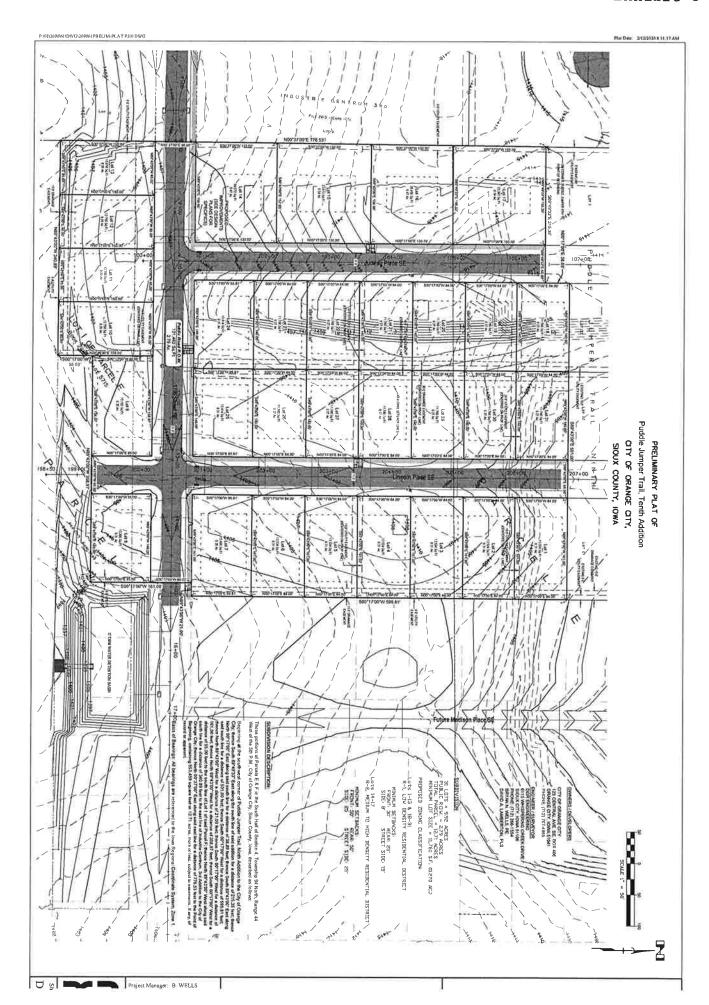
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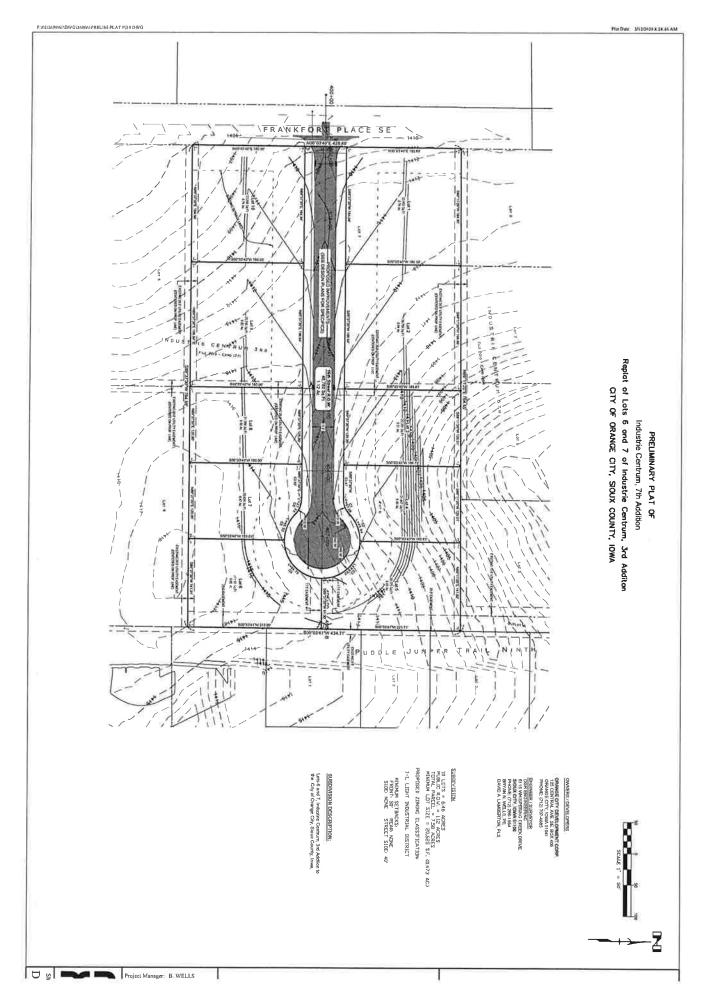
