## COUNCIL MEETING AGENDA NOTES February 15, 2021

- 1. The meeting will be called to order by Mayor Deb De Haan at 4:30 o'clock P.M.
- 2. Opening ceremonies. Pledge of Allegiance to our flag and a moment of silent prayer.
- 3. The agenda was prepared, posted and distributed in accordance with requirements of the Iowa Open Meeting Act.
- 4. This time is provided for citizen comments. It is suggested that if someone wishes to speak, we also ask for their residence. This time is intended for residents in the City limits.
- 5. The minutes of the February 1, 2021 council meeting are enclosed for your review. Exhibit 1
- 6. The monthly financial report represents cash balances for all funds. Exhibit 2
- 7. A Summary of Warrants report listing bills from January 19, 2021 through February 15, 2021 is enclosed for your review. Exhibit 3
- 8. Iowa law requires a public hearing and Council approval on our general government budgets growth from one year to the next. This year our growth in tax dollars is just 1.16% from our current budget to our proposed budget for 2021-2022. Based on our budget discussions, we will be holding our total tax levy at the same amount as last year, which is \$ 14.46. We would ask you to set the hearing for March 1st. Exhibit 4
- 9. This will be the second reading of proposed Ordinance No. 825, which adds Article 4, Rental Housing Units to Title 3, Building Regulations, Chapter 1, Building Code, to detail the requirements of a rental housing inspection program.
- 10. City Council needs to set the date of March 1, 2021 for a public hearing for the following attached twelve(12) of the thirteen(13) parcels applying for an 80/20 voluntary annexation to the City of Orange. Exhibit 5
- 11. City staff has been interviewing potential candidates for the lineman position vacated when Zach Wielenga left last fall. We would like to offer the position to Blake Snieder. Blake has been employed by the City of Boyden as water, wastewater, and street operator for six years. Blake is originally from Orange City and will fit in well with our crew.
- 12. This resolution will allow the City to be reimbursed for any expenditures paid in connection with the Orange City, MOC-FV Street Improvements project.
- 13. DGR Engineering has been working on the plans and specifications for this project and will be sending them out to contractors in the next week, with an anticipated bid letting on March 11. In preparation for this, we need to set a public hearing for the March 15 council meeting.
- 14. Earlier this fall, we awarded a contract to Vander Pol Excavating to install a 450 ft sanitary sewer main in the future North Weiland Addition. This project will be partially funded by a property

owner building a new home near the addition. The City has funded the remainder of the project and will assess these costs to the developer when they purchase property for the next addition. The project has been completed and we recommend paying Vander Pol \$52,377.92 for this project (one pay estimate) and accepting these improvements.

- 15. The Kings Engineering Fellowship (TKEF) would like to purchase the ground underneath their building. The ground is owned by the City of Orange City and part of the former airport. The piece of property is .431 acre. We are recommending selling it to TKEF for \$28,783. This is the same price per square foot that OCDC sells the smaller light industrial lots for in IC #6 & #7. We need to set a date & time for a public hearing for the disposal of city property. We would like to set the public hearing for March 1, 2021 Council Meeting.
- 16. We are in the process of refinancing some Electric Revenue Bonds. One of the steps is to have you read and approve the Preliminary Official Statement. This statement is available to anyone that is interested in purchasing these bonds. It describes who we are and what we have to offer in our community and details of our electric system. We have emailed this to you because of the length of the statement. We are recommending the approval of the report.
- 17. This is the final resolution in the process to issue the bonds. As the title mentions it is for approving the form of loan agreement and the document, we send to the County Auditor for taxing for payment of the bonds. Also, to approve the tax exemption certificate stating that we are a public entity that qualifies for the tax exemption and the continuing disclosure certificate stating what we will disclose to the public and bond holders for ongoing operations and if qualifying events occur.
- 18. We have received renewal applications from Don's Food Center for a Class E Liquor/Class B Wine/Class C Beer license and from Dollar General for a Class C Beer and Class B Wine license. Everything is in order.

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The City Council met in semi-monthly session pursuant to adjournment at 4:30 o'clock P.M. on February 1, 2021. A quorum was declared by Mayor Deb De Haan. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 125 Central Ave SE, Orange City, Iowa.

Agenda: A motion was made by Council member Daron De Jong and duly seconded by Council member Rod De Boer approving the tentative agenda as the official agenda. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Daron De Jong, Rod De Boer, Aaron Beadner, Steve Roesner, Tony Vande Brake; NAYS: None.

Citizen Comments: This time was provided for citizen comments and none were heard.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the January 18, 2021 and January 25, 2021 council meetings were presented. A motion was made by Council member Tony Vande Brake and duly seconded by Council member Aaron Beadner approving said minutes as published. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Tony Vande Brake, Aaron Beadner, Rod De Boer, Daron De Jong, Steve Roesner; NAYS: None.

Amend City Ordinances for the Addition of Title 3, Building Regulations, Chapter 1, Building Code, Article 4, Rental Housing Units: This being the time and place as advertised a public hearing was held to consider the addition of Article 4, Rental Housing Units to the City Code of Ordinances. They Mayor called for comments from members of the audience. Dale Pluim, representing the Planning and Zoning Commission, encouraged the Council to approve the ordinance. He expressed that is for basic safety, not extensive, and will also be helpful to know who is living where in case of emergencies. Tony asked if VRBO properties will be under this ordinance also. Kurt responded yes. Steve shared a phone call he received from a landlord who opposes the ordinance. Brad De Jong has reviewed the ordinance and feels it is providing safe housing and that it is a legitimate interest of the City in protecting citizens. The City Administrator reported that no written objections were filed. The Mayor then closed the time for the public hearing.

A motion was made by Council member Aaron Beadner and duly seconded by Council member Tony Vande Brake approving the first reading of proposed Ordinance No. 825, an ordinance adding Article 4, Rental Housing Units, to Title 3, Building Regulations, Chapter 1, Building Code. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Aaron Beadner, Tony Vande Brake, Rod De Boer, Daron De Jong, Steve Roesner; NAYS: None.

Board of Adjustment Appointment: Upon the recommendation of Mayor De Haan, a motion was made by Council member Steve Roesner and duly seconded by Council member Rod De Boer approving the reappointment of Gary Cleveringa to the Board of Adjustment for another 5-year term. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Steve Roesner, Rod De Boer, Aaron Beadner, Daron De Jong, Tony Vande Brake; NAYS: None.

Dutch Front Ordinance: Management revamped the existing Dutch front ordinance to bring it into compliance with the current practice of enforcement and matching funds. Steve shared concern about removing the mandatory wording, he feels that in the past it has brought property owners to go with some Dutch features versus an exemption. Earl responded the goal was to not have disgruntled people, hoping to still encourage participation. Tony expressed he feels that the new proposed ordinance accurately addresses everything that was a challenge in the past. After some discussion, it was agreed to table this item. Steve is going to review the wording and offer some suggestions. No official action was taken.

<u>Unity High School Project Request</u>: A motion was made by Council member Rod De Boer and duly seconded by Council member Tony Vande Brake approving the financial request of Unity High School for their addition of a gym, science labs, and a bus barn, along with some

renovations of locker rooms, etc. to Unity High School in the amount of \$250,000 at the rate of \$50,000 per year for five years. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Rod De Boer, Tony Vande Brake, Aaron Beadner, Daron De Jong, Steve Roesner; NAYS: None.
