 - d. one year- \$500.00
- 4. Revised Dangerous and Vicious Animal chapter.
- 5. Adding a new Noise Ordinance.
- 6. Added scooters to bike ordinance.
- 7. Added Dangerous Building Ordinance.
- 8. Added Hazardous Substance Spills chapter.
- 9. Created new permits for Peddler, Solicitors, and Transient merchants; Special Events; new Water/Sewer connections, Sound equipment.
- 10. Removed some job descriptions and duties; only including ones required by the State.
- 11. Updated all amended Ordinances and Resolutions from previous 2013 code update.
- 12. Edited Sound equipment section.
- 13. Trees within City Right-of Way will be adjacent property owners' responsibility and not the City. City will only remove trees they need down or trimmed.
- 14. Requested many minor changes to wording of current code. (Old vs. New Compare Changes/Notes- 716 items)
- 15. Made all Legislative changes to code.
- 16. Once Council approves the New Code we have the option to update at any time but recommended to do at the end of every year for any legislative changes or amendments made by the City. Doing this we eliminate the extensive review every five years.
- 17. Code will have an on-line version for easy access for residences and City Staff.
