COUNCIL MEETING AGENDA NOTES August 1, 2022

- 1. The meeting will be called to order by Mayor Deb De Haan at 4:30 o'clock P.M.
- 2. Opening ceremonies. Pledge of Allegiance to our flag and a moment of silent prayer.
- 3. The agenda was prepared, posted, and distributed in accordance with requirements of the Iowa Open Meeting Act.
- 4. This time is provided for citizen comments. It is suggested that if someone wishes to speak, we also ask for their residence. This time is intended for residents in the City limits.
- 5. The minutes of the July 18, 2022 council meeting are enclosed for your review. Exhibit 1
- 6. This resolution authorizes the issuance of the water bonds for the pipeline project. The resolution also approves the Tax Exemption Certificate and the Continuing Disclosure Certificate. This is the final action for the \$11,175,000 Water Revenue and Refunding Capital Loan Notes. We will be receiving monies on this issue on August 23.
- 7. City Council needs to set the date of August 15, 2022 for the public hearing for the disposal of City owned real estate for the Gelderland First Addition.
- 8. This is the place to set the date for the public hearing to discuss and consider the sale of City owned real estate to Justin Postma. Justin is currently adding on to his building and needs more parking to the west of the building for his construction business. City staff has reviewed the request and is suggesting the sale of the lot for \$5,656.00 plus \$1,500.00 survey fees. Exhibit 2
- 9. Vision Builders is interested in purchasing approximately 20 acres immediately south of the Puddle Jumper Trail and west of Jay Avenue for the proposed Canals Development. Brad De Jong is working on the potential purchase agreement.
- 10. The Puddle Jumper Park equipment and installation will be re-bid as a separate item from the remainder of the park project. By bidding this now we can take advantage of 2022 pricing. The remainder of the project will be re-bid later this fall for a 2023 construction. Several items have been modified from the original bid that should lead to cost reductions.
- 11. When the Industrie Centrum 7th Addition was constructed, MidAmerican installed electric to most of the subdivision. There are a few lots that had no potential buyers, so we elected not to install electric to these lots until there was demand for it. With the construction of two buildings on 17th St, we need to extend electric infrastructure and enter into an agreement with MidAmerican. In keeping with our practice from the rest of the development, the cost to the City will be \$15,905.
- 12. We have received renewal applications from Hy-Vee Dollar Fresh and Casey's for Class E Liquor Licenses. Everything is in order.
- 13. The Iowa State Code requires that we document a public purpose for employee recognition when something of value is given to an employee. The Council can indicate by motion that in recognition of efforts of employees to the City of Orange City you would like to hold an employee picnic and give a gift of appreciation.

Review of Fireworks Ordinance: The Council reviewed the current fireworks ordinance. Allen Vegter expressed opposition to the noise and debris that gets left behind, along with safety and fire hazard concerns. Earl shared a complaint received from Dutch Dogs about the impact it had on dogs at their facility. Mayor Deb mentioned shortening the time frame they are allowed. Aaron questioned fire dangers during a drought and the City having a water warning. Steve shared that the negative reactions are growing, he received more complaints than ever, heard some going off yet last night. Tony mentioned consistency with Alton with one police force. Rod suggested more education on social media on how to be a good neighbor, pick up debris, etc. Earl will discuss with staff and gather more information for the Council to consider in the near future. No official action was taken.

Highway 10 and Lincoln Avenue Traffic Signal Improvements Project Acceptance: A motion was made by Council member Steve Roesner and duly seconded by Council member Tony Vande Brake accepting the Highway 10 and Lincoln Avenue Traffic Signal Improvements. 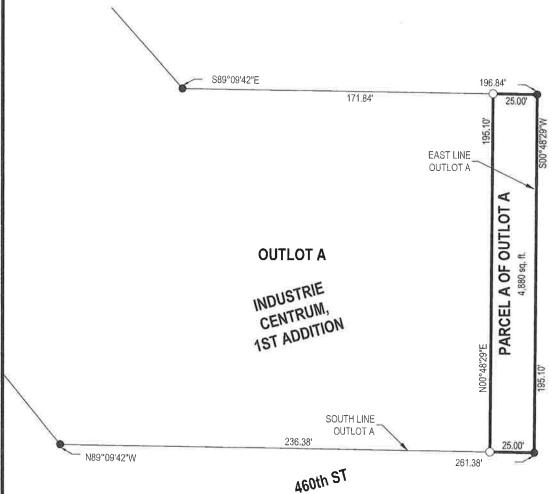
