#### water warning


- Lawn watering is limited to one time per week.
- Residential watering is based on the last digit of the property address: 0-1 on Monday, 2-3 on Tuesday, 4-5 on Wednesday, 6-7 on Thursday, and 8-9 on Friday.
- Commercial, industrial, government, and educational users may water lawns and fields in staggered schedules that do not exceed one time per week.
- No lawn or garden watering is allowed between noon and 5 pm.
- Watering or irrigating of flower and vegetable gardens is allowed up to one inch per week.
- Vehicle washing is limited with the exception of commercial
- Washing or cleaning of equipment, buildings, sidewalks, driveways, porches, etc. is prohibited.

#### firepit guidance

Residents are encouraged to be good neighbors with backyard firepits. Firepits are allowed for recreational use only and must be attended at all times. Please extinguish the fire when leaving. Please also consider your neighbors who may desire to have open windows to enjoy fresh air.

#### addressing a need

Have you ever needed to find a building when you're not familiar with the neighborhood? It's both frustrating and time consuming when there are no address numbers on homes or businesses. Imagine you're an EMT, police officer, or fireman responding to a call for help. Time is wasting while you look for the correct address. Street address numbers are not only valuable in an emergency, it's also lowa



law. The Code of lowa in Section 364.12(3d) and the Orange City Municipal Code of Ordinances both require homes and buildings be numbered. The numbers must be "in a conspicuous place to the street in figures not less than four (4) inches in height". Check if your house or building has address numbers and that they're visible from the street. If you don't have address numbers, install them for your safety. If you're not sure on the exact number, contact the City Office. We'll help confirm the correct number. It's a recipe for disaster when you need help and emergency personnel can't find you.
