OCDC/City Memorandum of Understanding: A motion was made by Council member Rod De Boer and duly seconded by Council member Tony Vande Brake approving the 2022 Memorandum of Understanding with the Orange City Development Corporation. Earl took this opportunity to thank Mark Gaul for the work he has done for the City over the last nine years. On call of the roll motion carried. <u>Review of Fireworks Ordinance</u>: The Council reviewed the current fireworks ordinance. Allen Vegter expressed opposition to the noise and debris that gets left behind, along with safety and fire hazard concerns. Earl shared a complaint received from Dutch Dogs about the impact it had on dogs at their facility. Mayor Deb mentioned shortening the time frame they are allowed. Aaron questioned fire dangers during a drought and the City having a water warning. Steve shared that the negative reactions are growing, he received more complaints than ever, heard some going off yet last night. Tony mentioned consistency with Alton with one police force. Rod suggested more education on social media on how to be a good neighbor, pick up debris, etc. Earl will discuss with staff and gather more information for the Council to consider in the near future. No official action was taken.

<u>Highway 10 and Lincoln Avenue Traffic Signal Improvements Project Acceptance</u>: A motion was made by Council member Steve Roesner and duly seconded by Council member Tony Vande Brake accepting the Highway 10 and Lincoln Avenue Traffic Signal Improvements. The final cost is \$436,069 which is approximately \$10,000 higher than the bid due to some additional traffic rerouting. On call of the roll motion carried.
