The Cities of Orange City and Alton, along with NW IA Area Solid Waste Agency, want to thank their citizens for helping us preserve our landfill. Your help came from the collection of over 21.3 tons of Household Hazardous Materials (HHM) over the last 9 years alone. Not only have we kept these materials out of our landfill, but these materials have not been put down our drains and contaminated our sanitary sewer system. You have saved the cities many dollars in landfill costs and/or sanitary sewer costs. Here are the pounds collected during HHM pickups here in Orange City:

2013 - 7,580 Pounds	2016 - 4,200 Pounds	2019 - 4,540 Pounds
2014 - 5,470 Pounds	2017 - 3,660 Pounds	2021 - 5,780 Pounds
2015 - 3,740 Pounds	2018 - 4,320 Pounds	2022 - 3,380 Pounds



home energy assistance program

The Low-income Home Energy Assistance Program (LiHEAP), offered through Mid-Sioux Opportunity, Inc., may be able to help you pay your winter heating bill. This program is funded through the lowa Department of Human Rights and has been established to help qualified low-income lowa homeowners and renters pay for a portion of their primary heating costs.

Your local Mid-Sioux office will be taking applications from November 1, 2022 through April 30, 2023. Each applicant will need to furnish a copy of their most recent heating and electric bill; original Social Security or I-94 card for each household member; and proof of the

household's income for the past month (4 weeks), the past twelve (12) months, or 2021 or 2022 tax return. Eligibility for participation is established according to the federal income guidelines listed in the chart above. Applicants eligible for an award will be paid on a first come, first served basis, and all payments are subject to availability of funds.
