Knight Center 28E Agreement Discussion: Recently the Knight Center 28E Board of Control approved Shared Use Guidelines for the Knight Center when City partners are using the facility. This time was provided for the Council to suggest changes to the guidelines that would then be brought back to the Board of Control for additional consideration. A lengthy discussion followed. Items discussed consisted of: Sunday use, week following Tulip Festival, third party bookings during the time committed to the Tulip Festival Night Show, information being shared with the full Steering Committee, look at other options for tear down after the festival i.e. use the Moving Company, and content of shows. NWIA Landfill Treatment Agreement: Matt has been working with the Northwest Iowa Landfill on their request to haul leachate from their facility to our wastewater lagoons. The leachate is collected from the landfill and is contained and treated in their onsite lagoon. Periodically, they need to empty the lagoon to allow additional leachate. While the leachate has some contaminants, our engineers feel it is easily treatable and would not have a significant impact on our lagoons or treatment plant. Part of this process is to complete a Treatment Agreement from the Iowa DNR. The City will charge the landfill a cost per gallon. A motion was made by Council member Rod De Boer and duly seconded by Council member Olivia Chapman approving the Treatment Agreement with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. PETITION FOR SEVERANCE

TO THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORANGE CITY, IOWA:

The undersigned, being the duly authorized representative of Alton Economic Development Corporation, as owner of the property herein described, does hereby apply in writing to the City Council of the City of Orange City, Iowa, that the following described real property be severed from the City of Orange City, pursuant to Iowa Code Sections 368.8 and 368.25A:

That portion of the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (SE1/4-NW1/4) of Section 3, Township 94 North, Range 44 West of the 5th P.M., Sioux County, Iowa, described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of said SE1 /4-NW1/4; thence North 89°16′01" West along the south line of said SE1/4-NW1/4 for a distance of 352.13 feet; thence northeasterly 66.33 feet along a non-tangent curve, concave northwesterly, having a radius of 150.00 feet, the chord of which bears North 25°05′23" East a distance of 65.79 feet to the southerly extension of the east line of Gelderland First Addition to Orange City; thence North 12°25′20" East along said east line and the southerly extension thereof for a distance of 380.30 feet; thence northerly 469.05 feet along said east line and the northerly extension thereof and along a curve concave southeasterly, having a radius of 900.00 feet, through a central angle of 029°51′37", the chord of which bears North 27°21′09" East a distance of 463.75 feet; thence North 42°16′57" East for a distance of 62.24 feet to the east line of said SE1/4-NW1/4; thence South 00°48′18" West along said east line for a distance of 893.52 feet to the Point of Beginning, containing 4.531 acres more or less. Subject to easements, if any, of record or apparent.

A map of the territory for which this application is being filed is attached as "Exhibit A."

It is the intent of the undersigned owner to voluntarily annex the above-described territory into the City of Alton, Iowa, in accordance with Iowa Code Sections 368.7 and 368.25A.

The severance would not create an island. The above-described territory does not include any railroad right-of-way. The above described territory does contain state-owned and county-owned right-of-way.

The undersigned requests that the City Council of Orange City approve this Petition, that Orange City send a certified copy of the City Council Resolution approving the severance to the City of Alton for filing with the City Development Board of the State of Iowa concurrently with the filing for voluntary annexation into the City of Alton, and that Orange City take all other steps necessary to complete the severance.
