# COUNCIL MEETING AGENDA NOTES February 20, 2023

- 1. The meeting will be called to order by Mayor Deb De Haan at 4:30 o'clock P.M.
- 2. Opening ceremonies. Pledge of Allegiance to our flag and a moment of silent prayer.
- 3. The agenda was prepared, posted, and distributed in accordance with requirements of the Iowa Open Meeting Act.
- 4. This time is provided for citizen comments. It is suggested that if someone wishes to speak, we also ask for their residence. This time is intended for residents in the City limits.
- 5. The minutes of the February 6, 2023 council meeting are enclosed for your review. Exhibit 1
- 6. The monthly financial report represents cash balances for all funds. Exhibit 2
- 7. A Summary of Warrants report listing bills from January 17, 2023 through February 20, 2023 is enclosed for your review. Exhibit 3
- 8. This public hearing is the first of two public hearings required by the State Code. This public hearing establishes the total maximum property tax dollars and the maximum tax levy for the fiscal year 2023-2024 for the City. Exhibit 4
- 9. We received bids on a new southwest well. This includes the drilling of two test wells and a production well. We received one bid from Sargent Drilling, the contractor who drilled our last well. The bid was \$1,079,061, as compared to the engineer's estimate of \$814,175. With the current bidding and construction environment, our engineers recommend approving this bid (recommendation letter enclosed). A project engineer from DGR will be present to provide an update on the project and review the well bid. Exhibit 5
- 10. The Annual Financial Report for the year ending June 30, 2022 has been prepared by staff and audited by Williams and Company. We will review the report with Justin Jacobsma from Williams and Company.
- 11. This is a resolution in the process of issuing the bonds related to our public-school infrastructure project and our Puddle jumper Trail Park. As the title mentions, it is for approving the issuance of the bonds and the document related to the pre-levy that we send to the County Auditor for taxing for payment of the bonds.
- 12. MidAmerican Energy is making several improvements to their distribution system around the east and north boundaries of the community. One of the segments along St. Paul Ave NE will be converted to underground. They have requested a 15ft easement between the ROW line and the walking/golf trail on the east side of Landsmeer. Exhibit 6
- 13. The following changes have been made to the Solid Waste and Refuse Collection contract: adjustments will be made to the monthly rates at \$.15 increase for every \$1.00 increase in the tonnage fee at the NW Iowa Landfill Agency, residential recycle pick-up shall occur two times per month, the City will charge a \$1.00/month administration fee, the spring cleanup flag cost will increase to \$15, and Christmas tree pickup will no longer be provided.

- 14. This will be the first reading of proposed Ordinance No. 841, which amends the solid waste collection fees for April 1, 2023 and January 1, 2024, and adjusts recycling pick up to twice per month. The rates will also be adjusted in July 2023 through the contract due to landfill fees increasing. Exhibit 7
- 15. City Administrator recommendation for employee salary and bonus adjustments. Proposal was reviewed by personnel committee. Exhibit 8
- 16. We have received an application for a Class C Retail Alcohol License from Brad's Breads and Bakery and a renewal application for a Class C Retail Alcohol License from Landsmeer Golf Club. We are still working on finalizing a few documents with Brad's Breads, they will be in place before final approval is sent to the state.

The City Council met in semi-monthly session pursuant to adjournment at 4:30 o'clock P.M. on February 6, 2023. A quorum was declared by Mayor Deb De Haan. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 125 Central Ave SE, Orange City, Iowa.

\$3,190,000 (Dollar Amount Subject to Change) General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, Series 2023A: A motion was made by Council member Daron De Jong and duly seconded by Council member Rod De Boer adopting a resolution approving the Preliminary Official Statement for the \$3,190,000 (dollar amount subject to change) General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, Series 2023A. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Daron De Jong, Rod De Boer, Aaron Beadner, Olivia Chapman, Tony Vande Brake; NAYS: None. The resolution was assigned number 2-6-23-2057 and appears in the official resolution book. Records are kept in Appendix 21.

Resolution Setting Public Hearing for Maximum Property Tax Dollars: A motion was made by Council member Aaron Beadner and duly seconded by Council member Daron De Jong adopting a resolution setting 4:30 P.M. on February 20 as the public hearing to consider the maximum property tax dollars for the 2023-2024 fiscal year budget. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Aaron Beadner, Daron De Jong, Rod De Boer, Olivia Chapman, Tony Vande Brake; NAYS: None.

Baker Financial Dutch Front Reimbursement: City Council approved the Dutch front financing for the Baker Financial building located at 1005 Lincoln Circle SE, which was estimated at \$80,000. Final invoicing shows the Dutch front and signage cost at \$138,500, with the City responsible for \$69,250 and optional engineering costs of \$5,000. A motion was made by Council member Daron De Jong and duly seconded by Council member Olivia Chapman approving the Dutch front reimbursement to Baker Financial for \$74,250 (\$69,250 plus \$5,000 for engineering fees). On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Daron De Jong, Olivia Chapman, Aaron Beadner, Rod De Boer, Tony Vande Brake; NAYS: None.

State Farm Dutch Front Proposal: A motion was made by Council member Aaron Beadner and duly seconded by Council member Daron De Jong approving the proposed Dutch front for the State Farm building located at 215 Central Avenue NE, excluding any reimbursement for signage since it does not meet Dutch front requirements. The estimated Dutch front cost is \$80,000. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Aaron Beadner, Daron DeJong, Olivia Chapman, Rod De Boer, Tony Vande Brake; NAYS: None.

Resolution Ordering Construction of West Substation Transformer and Setting Public Hearing Date: As discussed at budget time, several upgrade/replacement projects at the West Substation were identified. The replacement of one of the transformers is part of the second phase, however it should be ordered now due to a lead time of 24-30 months. A motion was made by Council member Rod De Boer and duly seconded by Council member Daron De Jong

adopting a resolution ordering the construction of the West Substation transformer and setting 4:30 o'clock P.M. on March 20, 2023 as the time for a public hearing. On call of the roll motion carried. The vote was as follows: AYES: Rod De Boer, Daron De Jong, Aaron Beadner, Olivia Chapman, Tony Vande Brake; NAYS: None. The resolution was assigned number 2-6-23-2059 and appears in the official resolution book.

Garbage Contract: Brad Wielenga from OC Sanitation presented proposed rate increases to the solid waste contract. Rates would be increased to \$16.55 for one 60 gallon toter, \$26.75 for two 60 gallon toters, \$18.55 for one 60 gallon toter with 95 gallon recycle, \$21.55 for one 95 gallon toter, and \$36.00 for two 95 gallon toters beginning April 1, 2023. Due to a landfill price increase on July 1, 2023 of \$5/ton rates will increase respectively to \$17.30/\$27.50/\$19.30/\$22.30/\$36.75. A third rate increase is proposed for January 1, 2024 of \$17.80/\$28.00/\$19.80/\$22.85/\$37.25 respectively. Brad would also like to increase the spring cleanup flag cost to \$15 from \$10 and discontinue the Christmas tree pick up. No official action was taken.

Resolution Ordering Construction of SW Well #4 and Setting Public Hearing Date: A motion was made by Council member Daron De Jong and duly seconded by Council member Olivia Chapman adopting a resolution ordering the construction of the SW Well #4 and setting 4:30 o'clock P.M. on February 20, 2023 as the time for a public hearing. This project will include the drilling of two test wells as part of the determination for the location of the production well. On call of the roll motion carried. At 1:30 PM on Tuesday, February 14, 2023, bids were opened at the City Office for the above referenced project. One bid was received and read aloud. The bid is detailed below, and a full bid tabulation is enclosed:

Sargent Drilling, Geneva, NE	\$1,079,061.00
Engineer's Estimate	\$814,175.00

The bid by Sargent Drilling was above the Engineer's estimate. However, we feel the bid is a fair price for the proposed work, especially given the current bidding environment and the limited availability of well drillers in the region. Sargent Drilling has worked with the City before including completing the SW Well #3 production well. Sargent Drilling has successfully completed projects of similar size and complexity to your current project; they appear to be a responsible bidder and have submitted a responsive bid.

The bid documents provided several alternate bid items, leaving several decisions for the City to make. The following paragraphs summarize the alternate items and our corresponding recommendations.

# Completion of one test hole as test well (Alternate Bid 1)

The Base Bid included completion of two test holes as test wells, one at each identified location. Alternate Bid 1 consists of completing only one test hole as a test well and abandonment of the other test hole. We will not know if both test holes warrant completion into test wells until drilling has occurred. **Therefore, we recommend awarding the Base Bid for completion of two test wells and rejecting Alternate Bid 1.** However, if the drilling results indicate that only one test well is warranted, Bid Alternate 1 can be change ordered into the project for a price reduction.

# Alternate Drop Pipe Materials (Alternate Bid 2)

The Base Bid included utilization of steel drop pipe material within the well. Alternate Bid 2 consists of utilizing fiberglass drop pipe in lieu of steel drop pipe. The fiberglass pipe would add approximately \$56,620.00 to the project costs. **Therefore, we recommend awarding the Base Bid steel drop pipe and rejecting Alternate Bid 2**.

# Alternate Pump and Motor Sizing (Alternate Bid 3)

The Base Bid included installation of a 200-hp submersible pump and motor along with the required power cable. Alternate Bid 3 consists of downsizing the pump and motor to 175-hp or 150-hp. We will not know what pump size will be needed until after the pump test is complete. **Therefore, we recommend awarding the Base Bid pump and motor and rejecting Alternate Bid 3**. However, if a 175-hp or 150-hp pump is needed based on pump test results, Bid Alternate 3 can be change ordered into the project for a price reduction.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 841**

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ORANGE CITY, IOWA, BY AMENDING THE RESIDENTIAL SOLID WASTE COLLECTION FEES AND FREQUENCY OF COLLECTION FOR RECYCLING

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Orange City, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. CHAPTER 106: COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE, SECTION 106.06 RECYCLING AND 106.10 COLLECTION FEES, subparagraph (1.A) and (1.B.3) is hereby repealed and the following adopted as follows:

- **106.06 RECYCLING.** The City shall provide for collection of recyclables from residential properties by contract with a private contractor. Collection of recyclable materials shall be provided two times per month.
- **106.10 1. Schedule of Fees.** The fees for solid waste collection and disposal service, used or available, are:

- **B.3.** Adjustments will be made to the changes above at the following rate: a \$.15 increase for every \$1.00 increase in the tonnage fee at the NW Iowa Landfill Agency.
- SECTION 2. <u>SEVERABILITY CLAUSE</u>. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudications will not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- SECTION 3. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>. This ordinance shall be in effect after final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
