### recapping another summer of fun in orange city

This year's summer recreation programming was a huge success, especially with the introduction of our new program, 'Crafting Connections'. Led by Dawn Steggerda and Leanne Bonnecroy, this program saw an impressive participation of 34 kids, fostering creativity and social interaction.

### Some fun statistics to highlight:

- 550 kids participated in this year's summer recreation programs.
- 262 kids took public swimming lessons
- 100 parent coaches helped with various programs
- 88 people attended the Movie in the Park
- Many local high school and college students helped coach, ref, and teach
- During July, the Orange City Pool saw over 5,250 admittances

A special activity was our bake sale put on by the 3rd-6th grade softball girls! They hosted this to support Hawarden and Rock Valley's recreation programs, raising over \$2,700! It was great to see the girl's excitement about helping others!

Park and Recreation director Noah Minnick shared,

### spotlight series: meet the water/wastewater department team

Each month, we take the time to highlight one of the city departments and the work they do for our community. In August is the Water/Wastewater Department and foreman Kirk Maasdam.

Kirk has lived in Orange City for 35 years and is married to Becky. They have three children: Josie, 24, Levi, 21, and Dylan, 17. He enjoys attending athletic events and coaching the MOC-FV football team.



Kirk has served in this role for 16 years and worked with the street department for 8 years. His department oversees the operation and maintenance of the water/ wastewater systems, including the water plant, wastewater plant, lift stations, and distribution systems for both areas. They ensure our town has clean, safe drinking water and the city's wastewater is treated and cleaned before discharge. The team includes Dave Sassman (21 years), Todd Klein (6 years), and Josh Kramer (5 years).

When asked about a typical day, Kirk shared:

"It starts with daily testing at both plants to meet DNR standards and to check lift stations to ensure everything is operating correctly. After that, it will be locating our utilities for contractors, assisting on city projects, and maintaining our systems."

### tree ordinance update

The city recently updated its Code of Ordinances, a practice that regularly happens every few years. As part of this process, the tree ordinance has been updated to clarify the responsibility for trees that are in the street right-of-way (the 10-20ft beyond the curb, typically between the street and the sidewalk). Below are the key parts of the ordinance.

- Homeowners should keep trees trimmed to a height of 15ft over the street and 8ft over the sidewalk.
- Trees that are damaged by wind or other weather are the responsibility of the homeowner to clean up and take away. City staff will assist with pushing debris from the roadway to minimize the impact on traffic. On occasion, as in the past with large damaging wind events, the city will coordinate curb pick up and disposal sites.

### How Do I Get A Permit/Schedule An Inspection?

The City of Orange City is pleased to offer residents, builders, and the business community Cloudpermit - an online system to apply for and track your building permits.

The Cloudpermit building permit system allows you to apply for and to see the status of your application anywhere, at any time. You can start an application and finish it later, and receive email updates on the status of your permit application. You can even request building inspections!

- Interior remodeling
- Fence
- Signs
