The City was recently awarded a Traffic Engineering Assistance Program (TEAP) grant from the lowa DOT to study traffic and pedestrian flow along the Highway 10 corridor. Specific areas of the study include the NWC campus as well as the MOC-FV high school area. Eight cameras were installed to monitor traffic and pedestrian movements. Engineers will use this information to provide potential ways to increase safety along Highway 10.

keep your sidewalks clear

Orange City property owners are required to keep their walkways cleared this winter, especially when you are out of town. When removing snow, never push or blow snow from the property, sidewalk, or driveway into the street.

Property owners are responsible for keeping their public sidewalks clear of snow and ice within 10 hours of accumulation. The City inspects uncleared sidewalks on a complaint basis, and if sidewalks remain uncleared upon inspection, the City will clear the snow and ice at the owner's expense.
