## stadscentrum celebrates grand opening with ribbon cutting

Stadscentrum opened its door to the public for the first time on Wednesday, May 6, 2015, with an open house and ribbon cutting. The evening started out with an open house starting at 5:00 pm, then a ribbon cutting at 5:15 with the Chamber Ambassadors. As an additional highlight to the evening, the Tulip Festival Steering Committee auctioned off signed print number 1/75 by artist John E. Vander Stelt at 6:30 pm. The art piece, entitled "A Faithful Walk," was commissioned for the 75th annual Tulip Festival. It sold for \$800 to Arlyn and Bea Schaap.

## garbage fees rising

The Northwest Iowa Landfill tonnage fees will be increasing by \$2.50/ton beginning July 1. Per our residential refuse rate ordinance, the trash fee will increase \$.10 for every \$1.00 increase in the tonnage fee above the \$30.50/ton, so beginning on the June utility bill, the trash fee will be increasing by \$.25/month.

## addressing a need

Have you ever needed to find a building when you're not familiar with the neighborhood? It's both frustrating and time consuming when there are no address numbers on homes or businesses. Imagine you're an EMT, police officer, or fireman responding to a call for help. Time is wasting while you look for the correct

address. Street address numbers are not only valuable in an emergency, it's also lowa Law. The Code of lowa in Section 364.12(3d) and the Orange City Municipal Code of Ordinances both require homes and buildings be numbered. The numbers must be "in a conspicuous place to the street in figures not less than four (4) inches in height". Check if your house or building has address numbers and that they're visible from the street. If you don't have address numbers, install them for your safety. If you're not sure on the exact number, contact City Hall. We'll help confirm the correct number. It's a recipe for disaster when you need help and emergency personnel can't find you.

## sewer rates to increase june 18, 2015

On June 18, 2015, Orange City residents and businesses will see an increase to their monthly sewer rates. Below is a couple of frequently asked questions related to the sewer rate increase.

**Q: Why are the rates going up? A:** The largest portion of the rate increase will be spent on upgrades to the sewer treatment plant. The City has been mandated by the federal Environmental Protection Agency to make upgrades to the existing system to meet new water quality standards for the water discharged from the treatment plant. The cost to complete this project is estimated at \$6 to \$10 million. We will have a closer dollar amount by year end. Regardless, this is a large investment to our treatment system and an increase in cost to you the customer.

**Q: What are the new rates? A:** The new rates shown below reflect a 20% increase. These rates are used for residential and commercial accounts.

Residential - Customer Charge \$13.00 / Volume Charge per 100 CF \$ 1.41 Commercial / Light Industry: Customer Charge \$ 20.50 / Volume Charge per 100 CF \$ 1.41

#### New Rate: Effective June 18, 2015

**Residential** - Customer Charge \$ 15.60 / Volume Charge per 100 CF \$ 1.69 **Commercial** / **Light Industry** - Customer Charge \$ 24.60 / Volume Charge per 100 CF \$ 1.69
